
FEATURE GRANT STORY

4-H Council - S.T.E.A.M.



The Washington County 4-H Council -River Valley 4-H has observed S.T.E.A.M. (science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics) education become a large focus in schools and youth organizations. To help encourage hands-on learning in this area, the Washington County 4-H Council – River Valley 4-H received a grant of \$2,000 from the Washington County Opportunity Fund held at the Washington County Community Foundation. This grant has enabled the purchase of 12 Wonder Workshop Dash Robots. Macy Hynek, River Valley District 4-H Youth Development Agent shared that "As the demand in technology grows, this money allows us to provide educational S.T.E.A.M. programming to local youth to

gain life skills and to spark interest in S.T.E.A.M. activities and potential career paths". Through this grant, local youth have learned to problem solve, adapt, work as a team, build resilience and be creative. The Washington County 4-H River Valley 4-H Dash robots have also been to community events and trainings to teach adult volunteers and other professionals the benefits of a robotics program.

Flagpoles and flowers were purchased and planted around the KSDS campus as part of the ongoing beautification project. The flagpoles installed in front of the KSDS Administration Building represent the United States, Kansas and KSDS.

The Community Foundation accepts and reviews applications twice a year to address current community needs. This year, the committee awarded over \$23,281 to 12 projects throughout the Washington County area.

Note: These grants do not include grants from our donor-directed funds.

Partnering with People: Rural Community Foundation Match Program

The Patterson Family Foundation partners with the Kansas Association of Community Foundations (KACF) to provide up to \$70,000 in matching funds to qualifying community foundations (like Washington County Community Foundation) as a way to support their match events. This initiative is designed to stimulate local philanthropy within rural areas across its catchment area of Kansas and western Missouri communities.

Washington County Community Foundation has received \$57,536 in matching dollars for its Match Month since partnering with the Patterson Family Foundation in 2023.

1 OUR FUND TYPES

The Community Foundation offers several different fund types to help you meet your charitable giving needs. Contact us to talk more about which one is the best fit for you. See a list of our current funds on page 12.

Designated Funds

provide a permanent source of income to support your favorite charities long after you are gone. You select the charities you want to support and we make annual grants in your name forever.

Field of Interest Funds

respond to current and future needs by letting you support a specific cause (arts, health, youth, etc.) or geographic area, rather than a specific charity. Grants are determined by a local committee.

Provisional Funds

provide a short-term vehicle to collect charitable donations for a community project or public-private partnership.

Donor Advised Funds

are simple and flexible "charitable savings accounts," that let you be involved in the grantmaking. You make a tax-deductible gift, and then recommend how the money should be granted each year.

Organization Funds

offer a simple and efficient way for your nonprofit to build capacity and provide long-term support for your mission through permanent endowed and nonendowed funds for more immediate needs.

Scholarship Funds

support student education and impact our future leaders. You help set the scholarship criteria and can also be involved in the selection process.

The Clifton Community Fund and The Hanover Community Fund have supported needs ranging from community beautification to supporting volunteer fire departments and have granted together over \$25,000 back into their communities. The Palmer Community Fund is new and will be receiving grant applications for the first time in the Spring of 2025.

Funds are available for each community through a competitive grant process. Nonprofits, schools, government, or religious organizations located within each of the communities can apply through the Washington County Community Foundation's Spring competitive grant cycle for project or program support. A local advisory board from each community fund reviews and determines the recipients and award amounts. By applying through the Washington County Community Foundation grant cycle, the organizations are also eligible to receive funding from other competitive grant funds.


